Seminar: I Think We Have Some Lortab Missing: Investigating Possible Drug Diversion and Preventing A Reoccurrence

In today's healthcare arena the nurse wears many hats. Unfortunately, stress and pressure can steer employees to abusing alcohol and drugs. We have seen a number of facilities in Alabama cited for Immediate Jeopardy for drug diversion in the past. Preventing drug diversion starts with a comprehensive review of a facilities overall system and does not just involve individuals suspected of stealing or using drugs. During this seminar hear and learn about ways in which you can put better systems in place and what some facilities have fallen victim to as a result of a lack of proper protocols and procedures regarding medication. The presentation will focus on the process of investigating, reporting and responding to a potential drug diversion, as well as provide practical tips and strategies for preventing diversion. All nursing facilities are responsible according to State and Federal laws to be accountable for all used, unused, discontinued, and expired medications. Do your facility policies pass the test?

Seminar: Practical Advice for Managing Hot Employee Issues

This presentation will provide practical advice and recommendations for dealing with two areas of grown concern for long term care employers, social media and Alabama's new gun law. Social media continues to plague employers. The rapid growth of social media has created both opportunities and challenges for facilities. Knowing where to draw the line with employees can be a daunting task. Several Alabama facilities have been cited for inappropriate use of social media by employees that have breached resident confidentiality and some have resulted in abuse citations. This seminar will also focus on the new gun law that went into effect August 1 that stated that Alabama employees have the right to lawfully possess guns in their vehicles on company property. Although employers may still prohibit guns in the workplace and prohibit workplace violence, employers may no longer have a blanket prohibition on all guns on their property.

Seminar: INTERACT®

INTERACT® (Interventions to Reduce Acute Care Transfers) is a quality improvement program that focuses on the management of acute change in resident condition. It includes clinical and educational tools and strategies for use in every day practice in long-term care facilities. It is designed to improve the early identification, assessment, documentation, and communication about changes in the status of residents in skilled nursing facilities. The goal of INTERACT is to improve care and reduce the frequency of potentially avoidable transfers to the acute hospital. Such transfers can result in numerous complications of hospitalization, and billions of dollars in unnecessary health care expenditures. This session will provide an overview of the INTERACT program as well as from several Alabama facilities who are currently utilizing this tool.
