NATIONAL NEWS

CMS Releases Changes to Survey Medication Pass Protocol and Materials Related to the Quality Assurance & Performance Improvement Program

The Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) released 1) changes to the SNF/NF Survey Medication Pass Protocol (including a form for use by surveyors); and 2) introductory materials for providers to use related to the Quality Assurance and Performance Improvement (QAPI) program. The implementation date for the survey protocol changes is July 1, 2013. *A copy is attached*.

According to CMS, the Medication Pass protocol has been modified to more effectively utilize surveyor resources and on-site survey time. For the Traditional Survey this protocol revision <u>eliminates</u> the requirement to extend the medication pass for another 20-25 opportunities if errors are detected in the first 20-25 observations. Additional guidance specifies that the surveyor will watch and document all of the resident's medications being administered at the time of the observation. Surveyors will not stop the observation in the middle of a resident's medication pass. If the surveyor reaches 25 medication observation opportunities when there are medications remaining for that resident, observe all medications being administered and add those opportunities to the total medication administration sample.

QAPI resources will now be easily available to providers. CMS is making the following set of introductory materials available on the CMS QAPI website (http://go.cms.gov/Nhqapi):

- **QAPI Tools** process tools, within QAPI at a Glance, to help providers establish a foundation in QAPI

- Video Nursing Home QAPI What's in it for you? introduces QAPI, its value to residents, their families and caregivers, and what is in it for nursing homes that embrace OAPI

Also, a new webpage to house QAPI training materials, tools and resources has been created on the CMS website. Moving forward, CMS plans to expand its QAPI efforts by developing resources for consumers.

Discharge Assessments and the Use of Dashes Video

"Discharge Assessments and the Use of Dashes" video will soon be activated on the Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) YouTube site; Access to this video will be made available on the MDS 3.0 Training page in the Related Links section or at:

(Please note once the 'What's New' notice is posted, that there potentially can be a lag time in viewing materials subsequent to the posting request, so if not viewable check back in 24 hours). Discharge Assessments and the Use of Dashes are addressed in our new MDS 3.0 Provider Update Training Series. This training series is the first web-based training offered in 2013 to providers addressing post-acute care topics. The video covers MDS

3.0 updates for the nursing home setting. It includes a CMS Introduction, a panel presentation explaining what the MDS 3.0 RAI Manual and the MDS 3.0 Assessment Instrument are, and includes two training topics. The first training topic focuses on our relatively new discharge assessments, and the second topic explains how to properly code with dashes.

Currently this video is viewable for the RAI Coordinators. HHS anticipates provider viewing to be live by the end of this week, so please stay tuned.

RAI May Updates

The American Health Care Association (AHCA) has provided a summary of the May 2013 RAI Updates. The majority of the updates involve minor edits, grammatical corrections, restatements to improve clarity, and added web links. A few updates are notable and include the following:

Chapter 2

• Section 2.8, page 2-39 – The direction has previously stated that the 5-day Medicare Assessment Schedule, Assessment Reference Date (ARD) must be set on day 1 through 5. The Update changed the ARD set from day 1 through 8. Don't be confused, the updated change incorporates the 3 grace days. The Scheduled Medicare PPS Assessments, page 2-40 of the RAI Manual, clearly shows the ADR days 1-5 remains and the grace days 6-8.

Chapter 3

- Section E0800 Rejection of Care, page E-16, Example 3 The number of days the rejection of care occurred was changed from 2 of the past 5 days to 2 of the past 7 days to be consistent with the number of potential days covered by the MDS E0800 data element.
- Section L added a statement related to mouth pain and the need to also code oral pain in Section J under pain. Example, resident having a tooth extraction or abscess and is now experiencing pain and it must be coded as such.
- Section M0210, page M-5 adds Mucosal Ulcers, ulcers developing from mechanical devises like catheters or tubing, and identifies that these ulcers are Not to be coded on the MDS. The rationale for this is that pressure ulcer staging is bases on skin and not mucosa. However, if the mucosal ulcer is related to the oral cavity, then it is coded in Section L, 0200 Abnormal Mouth Tissue.
- Section M0300, page M-6 addresses coding obscure pressure ulcer tissue with wound depth that cannot be measures as unstageable. However, if the wound bed is only partially covered by eschar or slough and tissue damage can be visualized or palpated, then the ulcer needs to be staged. M0300, page M-15 adds a Coding Tip that a pressure ulcer having exposed cartilage needs to be classified as a State 4 ulcer.
- Section M0800, page M-26 addresses wound debriedment and states that if by removing enough eschar and slough the wound becomes visible, the determination of wound worsening can be made.
- Section M1040, page M-35 incudes additional discussion language related to Moisture Associated Skin Damage (MASD).
- Section X0300, page X-3 states that if a dash was used in a record at A0800 and a record correction is needed, then a dash must be used in X0300 so that the record can be found in the system. Both A0800 and X0300 pertain the gender.

Chapter 5

• Section 5.7, pages 5-10 and 5-11 address updates to correcting ARD errors in the MDS. Providers are now allowed to fix ARD typos. Facilities can modify the record rather than inactivating it. However, if the ADR correction changes the RUG score, it is not allowed.

Update: Medicaid EXPEDITE to Go Live July 1

Members of the Alabama Nursing Home Association have been meeting regularly with Medicaid since last fall on ideas and ways in which we can improve the current Medicaid Nursing Home Eligibility process. As are result of our joint efforts, we will soon have an online web portal (EXPEDITE) for nursing facilities and residents/sponsors to use in order to complete the Medicaid application online and submit it electronically. Submitting a hard copy of the application is still an option.

Nursing Home Providers Tips for an Efficient Medical Review

- Please accurately complete the Admission and Evaluation Data (Form 161) in its entirety. This includes documenting the **name**, **Medicaid number and Date on pages 2 and 3 of the form.** If the recipient is a spend down, please check spend down on the form and give the dates of the spend down status.
- Please ensure that the Medicaid date is documented correctly on the Form 161. When the physician signs the form he/she is stating that "I certify this resident requires nursing facility care effective on the admission date appearing on this form".
- The facility is not required to send the entire medical record, only information that supports the request for LTC.
- Initial audit requests and requests for additional information must be submitted timely to
 avoid any penalties as referenced in the Administrative Code Rule number Rule no. 560-X10-. 07. Review of Medicaid Residents.
- If unstable medical condition is the qualifying criterion (criterion G), the medical record must contain information to support the condition and the active treatment rendered within 60 days prior to admission.
- PRN Oxygen is not covered; must submit MAR showing regular usage.
- Multiple criteria under K will count as one criterion.
- When criteria K is checked on Form 161, please submit at least 1 week of nurse's notes or ADLS flow sheets, approximately 1 week prior to the Medicaid admission date if transferring from Medicare to Medicaid. This information can also be documented on Form 161 under the section of Diagnosis and Pertinent Medical Information.
- Submit the full MDS prior to and closest to the Medicaid admission date.
- Cannot mark A and K7, MUST BE ONE OR THE OTHER.

- Cannot mark G and K9, MUST BE ONE OR THE OTHER.
- If the recipient is out in the community greater than 30 days, then the recipient will be a new admission and must meet at least two criteria.
- Transfer from out of state will require two criteria Cannot use preadmission screening information from another state.

Medicaid Recovery Audit Contractor (RAC) Audits – Second Round Coming

We have been notified by the Alabama Medicaid Agency that the next round of facilities scheduled for a financial Recovery Audit Contractor (RAC) will be coming soon. Facilities in this category will be notified by letter by Health Management Systems (HMS) – Alabama Medicaid Agency's financial RAC Contractor - requesting records related to Medicaid beneficiaries. These audits are mandated by federal law.

We are working with Medicaid to provide another webinar similar to the one held in January for facilities that are scheduled for this audit. Over the next few years all facilities will have a financial RAC audit. ANHA has no way of knowing when your facility will be scheduled. We encourage you to contact your financial and legal consultants to assist in preparation of this audit when you are notified.
